

Bachelor of Nursing (BN) Program:

#1 - I would like to apply to the Bachelor of Nursing program, what are the admission requirements?

- We do not admit students directly from high school (direct entry).
- Nursing is a professional program with limited seats, and a competitive admissions process. All students must complete the same entrance requirements and apply.
- Applications are submitted for a specific intake. Consideration to a subsequent intake requires a separate application.

#2 - What are the timelines for coursework completion, when does the application open, what is the deadline to apply?

#3 - Tell me about the agreement with University College of the North/UM program for nursing.

- Applicants have the option of applying to study at the Fort Garry campus in Winnipeg or at Thompson or The Pas as part of the University of Manitoba Bachelor of Nursing Program Collaborative University College of the North Cohort.
- Using an integrated approach, the same curriculum is delivered at all three sites.
- Admission is specific to the campus in which you have applied. Students are required to complete the program at the campus in which they have been accepted.

#4 - Tell me about the 28-month program I have heard about in the news.

- Starting Fall 2022, our BN program will be offered in an accelerated model.
- Students will attend seven (7) consecutive terms of study, leading to program in 28 months verses 36. For example, a student admitted for Fall 2022 will study in the following Terms:



Fall, Winter, Summer, Fall, Winter, Summer, Fall.

The 4-year BN curriculum has not changed, only the timeline for delivery.

#5 - How many seats are available each intake?

<u>Fort Garry Campus:</u> 240 students are admitted annually: 120 students in each of the following Terms: Fall, Winter, Summer (effective Summer 2023).

University College of the North: 20 seats Thompson campus and 20 seats The Pas campus

#6 - If I do not receive an offer of admission, is there a wait list?

- Each applications cycle, a short waitlist (ranked by AGPA) is created from the applicant pool after all spaces have been filled, in the event an offer is declined.
- Students should be checking their email on a regular basis. When an offer is made, it is time sensitive.

#7 - Is there a limit to the number of times I can apply to the nursing degree?

No, we do not have a limit to the number of times one can apply to Nursing.

#8 - What were the past AGPA cutoffs for previous nursing intakes?

Note: The AGPA cutoff varies from intake to intake, alongside the applicant pool

#9 - Will a student advisor calculate my AGPA for admission?

• No, we do not calculate AGPA for admission. The policy used to calculate an AGPA for admission to nursing can be found on page 8 of the applicant information bulletin noted above.

#11 - I already have a degree. Do I still need to complete the required coursework?

- Yes, all students who wish to be considered for the Nursing program must hold all the required coursework (see applicant information bulletin link in FAQ #8)
- The College of Nursing will only accept courses that have been completed in the past 10

The BN program is designed to be taken full-time. #14 - I am not admitted into the Bachelor of Nursing program yet, can I work ahead on Year 2 nursing courses? Nursing courses (NURS) within the Bachelor of Nursing program are available only to students who have been admitted. **Bachelor of Midwifery (BM) Program:** #15 - I would like to apply to the Bachelor of Midwifery program, what are the admission requirements? We do not admit students directly from high school (direct entry). Midwifery is a professional program with limited seats, and a competitive admissions process. All students must complete the same entrance requirements and apply to a specific intake. Canadian citizens and permanent residents are eligible to apply. #17 - How many seats are available each intake and, how competitive is admission into the program?

- Eight (8) seats are available each intake
- The average AGPA of admitted students in Fall 2022 was 3.75

#18 – I was accepted into Midwifery, but unable to attend. May I defer my admission to the next intake?

• No, if you are unable to attend, you must decline your offer of admission. Consideration to a subsequent intake requires a separate application.

#19 - Is the Midwifery program offered part-time?

• The Midwifery program is offered on a full-time basis.

#20 - What is the CASPer Test?

- 90-minute web-based assessment of interpersonal skills and decision-making abilities
- CASPer assesses for non-cognitive skills and interpersonal characteristics, personal values, and priorities.
- Applicants are permitted to take the test once per admission cycle.

#24 - Can I use Arts 1110 as my Written (W) English Requirement?

• Yes, Arts 1110 can be used to satisfy the 'W' requirement

Note: Arts 1110 does NOT count as a Social Science or Humanities requirement. Therefore, Arts 1110 cannot be used towards your 12 credit hours of Elective coursework required for admission.
